
















Age	 Dog	 Cat	 Rabbit
5 weeks			 Vaccination (repeat in one year)
8 weeks	 1 st vaccination Start to socialise your dog with other people and dogs within private gardens etc that unvaccinated dogs cannot access.	 1 st vaccination	 Your rabbit now has protective immunity to myxomatosis and viral haemorrhagic disease and can safely go outside.
12 weeks	 2 nd vaccination	 2 nd vaccination	
13 weeks	Your dog should have protective immunity from parvovirus, distemper and hepatitis following its vaccinations so it is safe to start walking it in public areas. Do not let it drink or swim in lakes etc. 		
15 weeks	 Your dog now has protective immunity from leptospirosis and can go swimming or drink from ponds etc.	 Your cat should now have gained protective immunity to cat flu, feline leukaemia and panleukopenia following its vaccines. It can now go to a cattery but don't let it outside unsupervised before it is neutered.	
4-6 months		Neutering. It is particularly important to neuter early if you have a male and a female kitten. 	Neutering.
8 months	Small breeds (<10Kg as adults) are fully grown and can move onto adult food. 		
1 year	 Medium breeds (10-20Kg as adults) are fully grown and can move onto adult food.	Change to adult food.	
1 year 6 months	Large breeds are fully grown and can move onto adult food.
